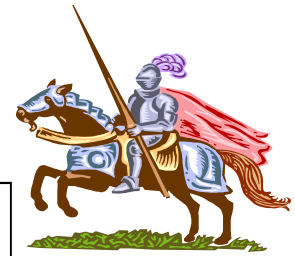

BOND PROPOSAL WOULD PAY FOR VARIETY OF LPS PROJECTS

On Oct. 13, Lawton voters will be asked to approve the "Yes for K.I.D.S." plan, which would authorize the sale of bonds and a one-half cent increase in the city sales tax to finance improvements across the school system.

The sale of school bonds would raise \$37 million over five years, two-thirds of which would construct, equip and furnish classroom additions, libraries, computer labs and facilities necessary to handle increased enrollment. Exact projects would be determined as LPS officials see where increases in enrollment are happening.

Bonds would be paid off through property taxes.

Funds would also purchase new computers, upgrade existing ones and purchase software and related resource materials for students; improve outdoor athletic facilities; add elevators and equipment to make schools more accessible to students with disabilities; and repair and replace instruments and uniforms and renovate facilities used by vocal music, band and orchestras.

The money would also be used to improve exterior security at all schools, including cameras, fencing, gates and automated lockdown equipment; and construct and renovate barns and greenhouses used by LPS agriculture programs, and purchase stock trailers and other equipment.
